### A. Terms of Registration

## COMPETITION SYSTEM AND MECHANISM

Perbanas Amazing Newbie English Debate Competition will be held online via Zoom on 26 - 27 February 2020 where Participants will deliver their arguments live through Zoom room breakout. This competition was carried out using the Asian Parliamentary system consisting of Preliminary 1, Preliminary 2, Preliminary 3, Quarterfinal, Semifinal, and Final. Here are the details of the Debate implementation:

## I) SYSTEM

Perbanas Amazing Newbie English Debate Competition is held using the Asian Parliamentary system which consists of Preliminary 1, Preliminary 2, Preliminary 3, Quarterfinal Round, Semifinal Round, and Final Round.

### A. Preliminary (Preliminary Round)

There are 3 preliminary rounds, there are Preliminary 1, Preliminary 2 and Preliminary 3.

### B. Quarterfinal Round

This round brings together 8 winning teams in the Preliminary round. The teams will compete in 4 debate rooms. 4 winning teams from each debate room will participate in the Semifinal round.

### C. Semifinal Round (Semi-Final Round)

This round brings together 4 winning teams in the Quarterfinal round. The teams will compete in 2 debate rooms. 2 winning teams from each debate room will participate in the Final round.

### D. Final Round

This round is the top round that brings together the 2 best teams from the Semifinals to determine Champion 1 and 2.

## II) MECHANISM

Perbanas Amazing Newbie English Debate Competition is held online through Zoom where Participants will present their arguments live through Zoom room breakout.

#### A. Check in

1. Each participant joins Zoom
2. Each participant is required to check in individually not in groups
3. Each participant checks in via Google Form link provided by the Committee
4. Each participant must check in according to the time determined by the Committee
5. Check in is only done once a day, that is in the morning, not per round.

## B. Roll Call and Match up

1. At this stage the Participants will declare their participation in each round and vote
2. At this stage the teams that will face each other will be announced
3. Announcements will be announced through the Zoom screen and WhatsApp Group
4. The timing will be monitored by the Liaison Officer as the Time Keeper



5. Participants are expected to change the Zoom display name according to the format determined by the Committee.

Format display name: Group Name\_Room\_Position\_Name

Ex: Group\_01\_Gov\_Alif

6. Next, Participants will enter the break out room after being invited by the Host.

### C. Motion Launch and Case Building

1. Then the motion will be announced in each room
2. Questions or clarifications can be made via WhatsApp Group
3. Case building time is 30 minutes starting from motion launch.

#### D. Debate

1. Each Participant must enter Zoom's room break out after the case building time ends
2. Participants are expected to conduct an audio check before starting to deliver their speech. Debate time is calculated after audio checking is complete. Ex: Am I audible?

3. Participants must first introduce themselves with the name and position format. Ex: Hi, my name is Alief, I'll be the first speaker of Government team / I'll be Prime Minister
4. Participants are required to turn off the microphone if they are not giving a speech
5. If the Participant wants to submit a POI, the POI can be done through the Zoom chat room or it can be done by turning on the microphone and saying "POI" then turning off the microphone again.

#### E. After Debate

1. Participants are expected to stay in the break out room when the Adjudicator is deliberating
2. The adjudicator will deliver verbal adjudication and announce the ratings in the debate.

## SCORING SYSTEM

1. The scoring system is using a score
2. Details of the scoring system based on:

### A. Contents (Content)

Content is assessed based on the strength of logic, the relevance of arguments, and the use of data related to the topic of debate.

This component accounts for 40% of the overall assessment.

## B. Style

Style is assessed by the way the Participants convey their arguments, such as adjusting body language, volume of voice, eye contact and variations in expression. This component accounts for 40% of the overall assessment.

## C. Strategy (Strategy)

Strategy (strategy) is assessed from the use of time by the Participants such as strategies of defence and resistance or response, as well as delivery structures. This component accounts for 20% of the overall assessment.

Weak contribution. Even without response, speech is unpersuasive.	70-73

## SCORING FOR DEBATERS

Comments	Substantive Speech
Contribution to the debate is insignificant or virtually nonexistent.	67-69

The margin between two teams (i.e. the difference between the total team points of the winning and losing teams) is between 0.5 to 16.

1.5 - 4 : Close

5 - 10 : Clear

11 - 16 : Thrashing

**A. Score Breakdown : 67 - 69**

- a. 67 : Standing still, Speaking in an incomprehensible language
- b. 68 : slightly more decipherable speech, still no contribution
- c. 69 : slightly more audible speaker finished with minimal contribution to the round. Failed to convey assertion.

## B. Score Breakdown : 70 - 73

- a. 70 : asserted arguments and poorly explained. Logical links are poorly explained
- b. 71 : asserted arguments with very minimum or vague explanation. Lacks clarity to accept the contribution. Logical links are poorly explained

- c. 72 : asserted arguments with an explanation however insufficient to count it as solid contribution. Logical links are poorly explained
- d. 73 : finished with acceptable contribution. Logical links are poorly explained



### C. Score Breakdown : 74 - 76

- a. 74 : fulfilled basic expectation with just enough explanation to make sense, many take-for-granted ideas
- b. 75 : fulfilled basic expectation. Intuitive logical explanation
- c. 76 : fulfilled basic expectation with greater extent of explanation and clarity

#### D. Score Breakdown : 77 - 80

- a. 77 : persuasive analysis and manner. Sufficiently explain  
unintuitive ideas or out-of-the-box explanation of intuitive ideas.
- b. 78 : persuasive analysis and manner. explain unintuitive ideas  
well or great explanation of ordinary ideas

- c. 79 : persuasive analysis and manner. explain unintuitive ideas very well or great and detailed explanation of ordinary ideas
- d. 80 : highly persuasive analysis that blow your mind and convincing manner, great examples, and high level of clarity in explaining unintuitive ideas.

#### E. Score Breakdown : 81 - 83

- a. 81 : exceeded speaker requirements, exemplary analysis and manner, loaded with convincing examples.
- b. 82 : superior speaker performance
- c. 83 : absolutely leave you convinced, and there will be nothing more convincing than their speech ever.

## FEEDBACK FOR ADJUDICATOR

1	T (1-2) *consider as complaint	Trainee. Unable to follow the debate, misrepresent the debate, unable to comprehend the reason of winning

## FEEDBACK FOR ADJUDICATOR

Score	Accreditation	Description
2	C- (3-4)	Low quality panel. Able to intuitively follow the debate, able to find reason of winning but often neat pick or provide uneven burden to team

## FEEDBACK FOR ADJUDICATOR

Score	Accreditation	Description
3	C to B- (5-6) *minimum to promote trainee	Panel, weak chair. Able to compare intuitive ideas, provide decision, and reasoning. Unable to comprehend complex debate or arguments. May be influence exclusively by manner

## FEEDBACK FOR ADJUDICATOR

Score	Accreditation	Description
4	B to A- (7-8)	Strong panel, average chair. Able to asses the debate with equal burden of proof. Able to deliver their verbal in a convincing manner although often times the verbal does not reflect the complexity of the debate



## FEEDBACK FOR ADJUDICATOR

Score	Accreditation	Description
5	A (9-10)	Strong chair. Able to assess the complexity of debate, argument, and rebuttals and reflected in verbal. Verbal was convincing and inclusive to all points. Able to pinpoint the same burden and not easily bought by manner or intuitive argument.

## COMPETITION NOTE

1. All three Participants must come from the same school
2. Participants must participate in all series of agendas
3. For teams that don't pass the preliminary round don't need to follow the agendas on day two
4. The time given for each speaker is 7 minutes and 20 seconds for substantive speeches and 4 minutes and 20 seconds for reply speeches
5. Participants must activate the camera during the event

## COMPETITION NOTE

6. Participants are required to turn off the microphone if they are not giving a speech
7. If there is a team member who is absent or not connected to Zoom at the time the debate starts, other members must give a speech in place of the member who cannot attend or is not connected to Zoom, where each Participant can only give a speech 2 times
8. The third speaker (3rd speaker / whip) cannot be a reply speaker

## COMPETITION NOTE

9. The adjudicator is neutral and the adjudicator's decision is absolute or inviolable
10. Participants are prohibited from entering and entering Zoom without clear reasons
11. Be respectful to each other. It is expected for adjudicators to provide their undivided attention during the round and to listen. After the round, it is expected for debaters to give their undivided attention to the feedbacks

## COMPETITION NOTE

12. We are all here to learn from each other and grow. Make best of the experience and do not blame others or treat others badly
13. Treat the organizing committee nicely, they are trying their best to help you
14. One school can register more than 1 team and if the payment made in one transaction please still upload the payment slip for each team's registration form. The documents do not need to be separated. It can be done by uploading the same file twice

## COMPETITION NOTE

15. Participants are not allowed to bring accompanying teacher or supporters because PANDCO 2021 will be held online
